Contractor sells Kelowna on AlL's economical bridging alternative

Mission Creek Regional Park is a 92-hectare nature reserve located in the centre of Kelowna, BC. The park contains over 12 km of hiking trails including a self-guided interpretation trail featuring two crossings over the Creek — one of which was in dire need of replacement.

The City originally tendered for a complete re-building of the existing Cottonwoods Bridge. However, Landmark, a contractor well-versed in the economical advantages of AIL's Prefabricated Bridges, approached us to confirm our costs and went back to the City with a very attractive alternative. They recognized the opportunity and moved on it right away.

A beautiful bridge for a beautiful place

Aesthetics were important in such a beautiful setting and we recommended a gently cambered truss design with naturally weathering steel finish and timber decking which totally suited its natural surroundings.
